

Committee and Finance Reports for Parish Council Meeting on Sept. 13, 2018

Witness Committee Parish of Mary, Mother of Mercy Meeting, Tuesday, July 17, 2018

The committee focuses on social justice, peace and community efforts regarding social concerns.

School Supplies/Fill the Bus

Through August 16th, the Parish is participating in the United Way of Seneca County's effort to distribute school supplies to all 4 districts in the county. 230 fliers with information about the program were inserted in the parish bulletin. Volunteers helped pick up supplies and cash donations and sorted for distribution the items collected. As of August 22, 13,440 supplies were collected and still more are coming into the United Way Office to be sorted, counted, and distributed to the schools plus a little over \$2600 that has been gifted.

In Tompkins County, St. James is cooperating with the United Way of Tompkins County's Day of Caring that collects clothing and school supplies.

Crop Walk / Walk for Food

This year the Crop Walk (Trumansburg) and the Walk for Food (Southern Seneca County) will both be held on Sunday, October 14.

This year, the plans are being made for the Walk for Food to take place on the track at South Seneca High School. It is hoped that there will be additional student and community participation with the walk taking place in town. The funds raised are equally split between the Ovid and Interlaken Food Pantries.

Winter Coat/Clothing Collection

Organized by the Seneca County Christmas Project, the winter coat drive is conducted in the fall for children of needy families. Collection bins to donate new or slightly used coats are set up in Holy Cross and St. Francis churches. Typically, mittens, gloves and scarves are also collected. Volunteers are needed to distribute the coats at the Ovid VFW on October 20. St. James cooperates in the Catholic Charities "Share the Warmth" program in September by having a collection bin in the church. Trumansburg parishioners also have an opportunity to donate needed winter items through their "Mitten and Hat Tree" where members bring donations and attach to a dowel rod tree.

Seneca County Christmas Project

Our parish participates in this volunteer-run county group effort. Families complete an income-based criteria application at the two south end food pantries, Ovid and Interlaken, to receive presents for children 12 years of age and under, and gift certificates for children over 12 years of age. Parishioners donating to a family remove a tag from the "Angel Tree" and buy the gifts listed for that family. We support families at the north end of the county and the north end participants provide gifts for families in the south end. Our parishioners also volunteer with other community members to distribute the gifts in December.

Thanksgiving Food Drive and Personal Care Items via Local Food Pantries

We cooperate with the Interlaken and Ovid Food Pantries to collect special food items for Thanksgiving dinners, such as vegetables and stuffing, and ask our parishioners to donate personal care items, also needed by food pantry patrons, such as shampoo and toothpaste, during the month of May. Parishioners are also involved with the Trumansburg Food Pantry but could use volunteers to help.

Home-Bound Card Ministry

Marilynn Frank keeps a list of home-bound and nursing home parishioners and volunteers send note cards on a monthly basis to them. These notes might include updates on the parish and community, and general good wishes in the greetings. Father Bernard updated Marilynn on the list of individuals he visits and those names were added to the mailing list.

Prayer Chain

Cathy Millspaugh volunteered to coordinate a telephone Prayer Chain when parishioners request special prayers for family members and friends in need.

Social Justice

The committee was updated on the Rochester Diocese information relating to the opioid crisis affecting our communities. We discussed our possible activities, the importance of connecting to existing groups/programs and expertise in the community (including surrounding churches). A notice will be placed in the church bulletin to get an idea of the involvement our community might be willing to take on.

We have a parishioner involved in the Seneca County's Prevention program, Mary Joslyn, who could be a resource for more parish involvement.

Father Bernard requested committee follow-up on a parishioner's interest in the Catholic Peace Fellowship Group. Michelle, as chair, will gather information on how other churches are involved and the impact on their church.

Gerry Frank asked that the committee include **SouperBowl of Caring** (on Super Bowl Sunday) and the **Weekend Backpack Program** (in February after the Super Bowl) during our next meeting.

Fellowship Chair Report for September 2018

We had socials after the Masses for the feast days of St. Francis and St. James and also for the Feast of the Assumption. The feast day for Holy Cross on Sept 14th is pending.

Those members who were available assisted with the Parish picnic.
