## **School Supply Collection**

*Seneca County* United Way of Seneca County collected over 1,000 dollars for the 2017 *Fill the Bus* campaign. The monetary donations were given to the school districts proportionate to the number of students.

*Tompkins County* The 2017 *Day of Caring* on Wednesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> yielded over 100 boxes of nonperishable food items and they were donated to the United Way of Tompkins County. Personal care items, along with pet and school supplies were also collected for donation.

# Winter Coat Collection

Seneca County The winter coat drive at Holy Cross and St Francis started the weekend of September 17<sup>th</sup> and ended the weekend of October 1<sup>st</sup>. Volunteers met with 16 families on Saturday, October 7<sup>th</sup> at the Ovid VFW. A total of 36 children received coats, gloves, mittens and scarves. This number is down from previous years. The above average temperatures this fall might have been a factor. Coats donated by Holy Cross and St. Francis parishioners are shared locally. Children's coats left are taken to the Romulus Central and South Seneca Central school districts. Adult coats left are taken to the South Seneca (Ovid) Food Pantry and the Interlaken Food Pantry for distribution to their clients.

*Tompkins County* Catholic Charities of Ithaca/Tioga run an annual cold weather clothing drive - *Share the Warmth*. They are in their 25<sup>th</sup> year of collecting donated coats and winter accessories from the community. This year the campaign kicks off on November 2<sup>nd</sup> with donations accepted throughout the month at numerous locations. Distribution is in December through the Samaritan Center, free of charge to individuals in need of those items. St. James parishioners can donate new or gently used winter clothing and blankets. A collection bin at St. James will be available and will be accessible until the end of the month. Catholic Charities is seeking volunteers to help with the event and more information regarding the particular needs will be forthcoming. The hat/mitten/scarf tree donations at St. James are also taken to Catholic Charities.

**Thanksgiving Food Drive** The Witness Committee meets this Thursday. We will talk about an organized food collection for the Ovid and Interlaken pantries in Seneca County, and the Trumansburg food pantry in Tompkins County to assist those families in need this holiday season.

## **Christmas Project**

*Seneca County* Three days remain for taking applications. Volunteers will be at the Ovid Food Pantry on Monday, November 6<sup>th</sup> and at the Interlaken Food Pantry on Fridays, November 3<sup>rd</sup> and November 10<sup>th</sup>. The angel trees should be up by Thanksgiving at both Holy Cross and St. Francis.

The Christmas distribution will be at the Ovid VFW and is still set for Wednesday, December 13<sup>th</sup>.

*Tompkins County* The St. James Women's Guild will again sponsor an Ulysses Christmas Bureau family and the St. James Youth Group will again do all the shopping. Marina Delaney is assisting the youth group in this effort.

We would like to continue with the *Reverse Advent Calendar*. It is a nice family Advent activity and a creative way to give to those in the community. Families collect for the food pantry by adding a food item or personal care item to a basket or box in the house each day of Advent. A bulletin announcement will be submitted.

**Seneca County Social Justice Ministry** Deacon Gregory Kiley has scheduled this ministry meeting and has invited parish members from Seneca County churches. It will be an opportunity to hear what the Diocese and Catholic Charities are doing and what they are proposing. The meeting will also be an opportunity for parish committees to bring their "ideas, proposals and hopes to Catholic Charities and Diocese as a whole". Deacon Gregory would like these social justice committee meetings to be held monthly. We need to discuss representation and participation.
