



### **Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025**

The Ordinary Jubilee Year - the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord - will begin in all the dioceses throughout the world this Sunday, December 29<sup>th</sup>, Holy Family Sunday. It will conclude on December 29, 2025 - Holy Family Sunday. A Jubilee Year has been proclaimed every twenty-five years since the thirteenth century. The theme for this Jubilee Year is "Pilgrims of Hope." As pilgrims, they are anchored in their encounter with Jesus. As pilgrims of hope they bring Christ and his message of hope to the world by working for peace and an end to conflicts, promoting human life, showing amnesty to prisoners, upholding the dignity of migrants, healing the sick and accompanying the elderly - or even through the forgiveness of debts, a custom of jubilee years in the Old Testament. The celebration of jubilee years typically includes pilgrimages, processions, celebrations of Mass, and an invitation to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. These celebrations are opportunities to receive the Lord's mercy, and lead to the performance of works of mercy.

### **Adult Study:**

Everyone desiring to know and discuss our faith are invited to attend classes on Saturdays (with one exception, the second Saturday of the month) at 5:00-6:15 p.m. at the St. Francis Solanus annex. These sessions are also helpful for people desiring to be received into the church and for Catholics preparing to celebrate Confirmation and First Communion. The January 4<sup>th</sup> topic: *The Church is One, Holy, Catholic & Apostolic.* 

### **Eucharistic Holy Hour – Encounter Night:**

*Encounter Nights* provide an opportunity to gather in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, listen to Sacred Scripture, observe a sacred silence for reflection, encounter Jesus in a personal way, and conclude with Benediction.

The next *Encounter Night* will be this Thursday, January 2, from 6:30–7:30 p.m. at St. Francis Solanus. For many in the parish it will mean making the sacrifice to travel. There will be no encounter night in February.

### This Sunday:

The feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is celebrated on the first Sunday after Christmas. It is a family day celebration and a good time to gather families to celebrate the family's union with Jesus in the Eucharist (Holy Communion).

### New Year's Day Masses:

January 1, 2025 is a holy day of obligation in celebration of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and the Octave Day of the Nativity of the Lord. The Mass schedule is: Tuesday, December 31

### **Cemetery- Right to Burial Plot Cost:**

The cost of buying a plot at both St. James the Apostle and Holy Cross cemeteries will be increasing as of January 1, 2025. A plot purchase provides you with the right for burial in either the traditional part of either cemetery or, at St. James, in the green section. Presently the price to purchase a traditional plot is \$700. On January 1 that will increase to \$900. To purchase a plot in the green section at St. James will increase from \$950 to \$1000. ### Victims of Sexual Abuse:


