



Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025:

The Ordinary Jubilee Year - the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord - began in all the dioceses throughout the world on Sunday, December 29th. It will conclude on December 29, 2025. A Jubilee Year has been proclaimed every twenty-five years since the thirteenth century. The theme for this Jubilee Year is "Pilgrims of Hope." As pilgrims, they are anchored in their encounter with Jesus. As pilgrims of hope they bring Christ and his message of hope to the world by working for peace and an end to conflicts, promoting human life, showing amnesty to prisoners, upholding the dignity of migrants, healing the sick and accompanying the elderly - or even through the forgiveness of debts, a custom of jubilee years in the Old Testament. The celebration of jubilee years typically includes pilgrimages, processions, celebrations of Mass, and an invitation to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. These celebrations are opportunities to receive the Lord's mercy, and lead to the performance of works of mercy.

Christmas Season:

This Sunday, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, many times referred to as "Little Christmas". The Christmas Season always ends with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. This year that feast day occurs on Sunday, January 12, 2023.

Sweet Sunday:

This Sunday, and the first Sunday of every month, all are welcome to a social hour following the 9:00 a.m. Mass at St. James the Apostle, Trumansburg.

Parish Council Meeting:

There is a parish council meeting this Thursday, January 9, at 7:00 p.m. in the Parish Center, St. Francis Solanus.

Adult Study:

Everyone desiring to know and discuss our faith are invited to attend classes on Saturdays (with one exception, the second Saturday of the month) at 5:00-6:15 p.m. at the St. Francis Solanus annex. These sessions are also helpful for people desiring to be received into the church and for Catholics preparing to celebrate Confirmation and First Communion. The January 18th topic: *The Church is One, Holy, Catholic & Apostolic.*
