

Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025:

The Ordinary Jubilee Year - the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord - began in all the dioceses throughout the world on Sunday, December 29th. It will conclude on December 29, 2025. A Jubilee Year has been proclaimed every twenty-five years since the thirteenth century. The theme for this Jubilee Year is *"Pilgrims of Hope."*

Adult Study:

Everyone desiring to know and discuss our faith are invited to participate in classes on Saturdays (with one exception, the second Saturday of the month) at 5:00-6:15 p.m. at the St. Francis Solanus annex. Capuchin Franciscan Fathers Robert Phelps, Norbert DeSousa, and Jack Rathschmidt will periodically be covering the weekend Masses. Fr. Brendan Buckley will be covering the 8:30 a.m. Masses on Tuesday to Friday at St. Francis Solanus Church. Kathleen Rourke will lead a communion service on Mondays at 9:00 a.m. at St. James the Apostle Church.

Catholic Courier:

The Diocesan Catholic newspaper is mailed to all Diocesan Catholic households at a cost to the parishes. Our parish bill is \$430 monthly. The cost to the parish is \$13.60 annually for each household. Our parish has an annual second collection to help defray the cost. The collection will be taken up on the weekend of February 9th and a suggested offering is \$11.00 per household. Whatever help you can give be is appreciated.

Collection Counters Needed at St. James:

Our parish needs help counting weekly collections at St. James the Apostle. Currently, we are in need of substitutes. <u>As a substitute, you **would not**</u> <u>be committing to a schedule.</u> Your help would only be requested if a regularly scheduled counter is unavailable.

Collection counters work in teams of three, typically meet after the 9:00 a.m. Mass at St. James, and the entire process takes around an hour.

Please consider helping! This is an important ministry, and we rely completely on volunteers. The more volunteers we have, the less the burden is on any one person.

"SouperBowl" Sunday—February 9:

SouperBowl Sunday is a national ecclesiastical event. By raising food and money, it draws attention to those experiencing the need for food in our communities. All food and funds raised in our parish will stay in the local food pantries in Interlaken, Ovid, and Trumansburg.

On February 9th, a basket will be in the back of the churches for any monetary donations that you might wish to make. Joan Craig Estate

The Parish of Mary, Mother of Mercy, has received a generous bequest in the amount of \$650,000 from the estate of Mrs. Joan Craig, a parishioner, who died on May 4, 2020.

After consultation with the Finance Council, it has been decided that the bulk of this bequest be used for the Parish and to build up the Cemetery Permanent Maintenance Funds for Holy Cross and St. James Cemeteries. These funds have been invested in the Communis Fund- a long-term Asset Management Program sponsored by, but independent of, the Diocese of Rochester. The income from each Cemetery Fund will be used as needed to cover annual cemeteries expenses and income from the Parish Fund will be used as necessary to supplement collection income. Further details can be requested as desired. **Regarding the Cemetery Permanent Maintenance** Funds Communis accounts each cemetery is now 63% funded - not yet fully funded. Your continued generosity to our monthly second collections for our Cemeteries is greatly appreciated.

National Prayer for Life:

This Thursday, January 23rd, Immaculate Conception Church, Ithaca is uniting the Southern Tier part of the Diocese of Rochester and with dioceses around the country in a vigil of prayer for the sanctity of all human life. The time of prayer will begin at 6:00 p.m. with Mass followed by adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and confessions.

Death Penalty:

The Church, pro-life, has condemned death as a penalty for crimes committed and has pleaded with all nations to end the death penalty. In keeping with the gospel principles of forgiveness, mercy, etc., the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has thanked President Biden for commuting the death sentence, not their prison sentence, of 37 men on federal death row.

Mission of the Family:


