

Eucharistic Revival "Invite one back Initiative" Prayer: God our Father,

You never cease to seek out your children—the lonely, the frightened, the hurt, and the lost. We pray for all our parishioners who have been missing from our parish community and Eucharistic celebrations.

Through the intercession of Mary, please pave the way for conversations and invitations that welcome them back to the Catholic Church and our parish Community. We trust in your love and mercy for every one of your children. Amen.

Next Sunday:

The beginning of the new Church year, 2025, begins with the First Sunday of Advent, which is next Sunday. "Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight."

Eucharistic Revival–Invite One Back initiative:

Many Catholics have stopped participating in the Church. This year has been designated by the National Eucharistic Revival as a Year of Mission. During September, October, and November, our parish has been praying for over 200 parishioners whose names have been submitted for prayer to return to the Lord in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We will no longer pray the formal prayer for their return at the end of Mass, but we encourage parishioners to continue praying that prayer. Now is the time, the Season of Advent, the month of December, for parishioners, in a hospitable way, to personally invite a parishioner back to encounter Jesus in Holy Communion. You might encourage them to celebrate the Sacrament of Confession also to have the assurance of reconciliation, forgiveness, and union with God who throws our sins behind us never to be remembered. We Catholics

today are more aware than ever that we must be missionaries – be invitational, like Jesus. "Invite one back."

Thanksgiving Day:

This Thursday is a national holiday. The Thanksgiving Mass will be celebrated on Wednesday, the day before Thanksgiving, at 4:00 p.m. at St. Francis Solanus Church.

The appointment notifications have arrived at the parish. The ten Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may pick up the notification in the church sacristies.

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception:

The patronal feast day of the United States is December 8th. This year it falls on the Second Sunday of Advent which takes precedence over feast days. This year the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception will be celebrated on Monday, December 9th, together with the obligation for the faithful to attend Holy Mass.

There will be two Masses:

9:00 a.m. at St. James the Apostle, Trumansburg
6:00 p.m. Mass at Holy Cross, Ovid.

Following both Masses will be an opportunity for the Sacrament of Rconciliation.

Cemetery- Right to Burial Plot Cost:

Our parish has two cemeteries. As of January 1, 2025, the cost to purchase a right for burial in Holy Cross and St. James the Apostle cemeteries is \$900 for a traditional plot. St. James the Apostle Cemetery has a green section in the cemetery (no casket) and the cost for a right to burial plot is \$1,000.

Psalm:


The Lord is king; he is robed in majesty. (Ps. 93)
