

Eucharistic Revival "Invite one back Initiative" Prayer:

God our Father,

You never cease to seek out your children—the lonely, the frightened, the hurt, and the lost. We pray for all our parishioners who have been missing from our parish community and Eucharistic celebrations.

Through the intercession of Mary, please pave the way for conversations and invitations that welcome them back to the Catholic Church and our parish Community. We trust in your love and mercy for every one of your children. Amen.

Proposal One – Equal Rights Amendment:

As you may be aware, a referendum that is on the general election ballot for this November is asking voters to approve or reject what is known as an Equal rights Amendment to the New York State Constitution. While some of the language of the proposed amendment is unobjectionable, the New York State Catholic Conference, which represents the Bishops of New York State in public policy matters, strongly opposes the referendum for important reasons. LifeRoc.org (the website for the Diocese of Rochester Office of Life Issues) has a page dedicated to information for education and awareness about the severe consequences the approval of this Ballot Proposal could mean to our families, our children, our parents, and our church's religious freedoms. Please visit and share far and wide this information via the communication networks that are available to you. The page will be updated regularly with information to help our communities and beyond vote with their Christian formed consciences.

Eucharistic Revival – Invite One Back initiative:

Many Catholics have stopped participating in the Church. This year has been designated by the National Eucharistic Revival as a *Year of Mission* – that is in a hospitable way invite a parishioner back to encounter Jesus in Holy Communion.

We invite parishioners to record the name(s) on the forms provided in the pews, of a Catholic(s) (parishioner or not) who has stopped coming the Sunday Mass. The names will not be published, however, over the next few months they will be prayed for during the Sunday Masses and at the beginning parish events. One hundred and seventy names have been submitted. During the Season of Advent, in some way, shape, or form, personal contact / invitations will be given to members of our parish family for whom we have been praying will return to the parish family and the Eucharist.

Catholic Ministries Appeal:

The guidelines highlight: For Catholics, For Our Fellow Christians, For Those Not Receiving Holy Communion, and For Non-Christians. Also, in the hymnal beginning on page 331 to 337 there is a section of Catholic prayers.

Knights of Columbus

The Knights of Columbus Ithaca Council are expanding their activities to include all parishes based in Tompkins County including The Parish of Mary, Mother of Mercy. As their first program, they have installed a kiosk in each church containing fifteen different pamphlets that provide guidance and insight into different elements of strengthening Catholic families. These materials are complimentary, and all parishioners and visitors are encouraged to select any of interest and share with others.

The Knights are also working to establish a core working group within the parish to bring other pro-

grams forward that are designed to strengthen faith, families, community, and life within parishes. At the top of the kiosks are flyers with information regarding membership and who to contact for information.

Jubilee Year 2025:

On Thursday, May 9, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, Pope Francis officially proclaimed the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025 something which happens every 25 years. The Solemn opening for the Jubilee Year in our Diocese will be Sunday, December 29, 2024. The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope", and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis.
