

Eucharistic Revival"Invite one back Initiative" Prayer:

God our Father,

Through the intercession of Mary, please pave the way for conversations and invitations that welcome them back to the Catholic Church and our parish Community. We trust in your love and mercy for every one of your children. Amen.

Eucharistic Revival-Invite One Back initiative:

Many Catholics have stopped participating in the Church. This year has been designated by the National Eucharistic Revival as a *Year of Mission* – that is in a hospitable way invite a parishioner back to encounter Jesus in Holy Communion.

We invite parishioners to record the name(s) on the forms provided in the pews, of a Catholic(s) (parishioner or not) who has stopped coming the Sunday Mass. The names will not be published, however, over the next few months they will be prayed for during the Sunday Masses and at the beginning parish events. This prayer can be found in the Sunday bulletin. For the next two months we invite you to say this prayer daily. One hundred and ninety names have been submitted. During the Season of Advent, in some way, shape, or form, personal contact / invitations will be given to members of our parish family for whom we have been praying will return to the parish family and the Eucharist.

Cemetery Collection Next Weekend:

Next weekend is the second collection to benefit the Mary, Mother of Mercy parish cemeteries. The cemeteries do not generate regular income and do not have a fully funded Permanent Maintenance Fund. Please give what you are able as this collection helps to defray costly maintenance expenses. Donations may also be made online using WeShare Online Giving.

Please note that the monetary donation to the cemetery can be specified either for St. James the Apostle or the Holy Cross cemetery. When the monetary donation is not specified, your donation is divided between the two cemeteries. Thank you for your help.

Sweet Sunday at St. James:

Next Sunday, there will be a social hour following the 9:00 a.m. Mass. All are welcome to attend. There will also be an opportunity for parishioners to plant Hyacinth bulbs by the Blessed Virgin Mary statue at this time.

Adult Study:

All Saints' Day:

November 1st, Friday, is a holy day of obligation. It is the day the Church throughout the world rejoices in all the people, blest in the eyes of the Lord, who stand in God's holy place and sing of the love the Father has bestowed upon them through the blood of the Lamb. There will be two Masses:

° 9:00 a.m. at St. James the Apostle, Trumansburg, and ° 6:00 p.m. at Holy Cross, Ovid.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be held following each Mass. The scheduled confessions / dialogue at St. Francis Solanus with Fr. Bernard on Fridays, 6:30 – 7:30 p.m. will be cancelled on November 1st.

All Souls Day:

It is a day that follows the Holy Day of Obligation, All Saints Day. It is the day our Church remembers and prays for our beloved deceased. There will be a 9:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday, November 2nd at St. Francis Solanus Church. During the Mass we will call out the names of those whose funeral service was celebrated by the parish. In the pews this Sunday there are All Souls Day envelopes for recording the names of your beloved deceased. The envelopes will be placed on the altar during the month of November and daily they will be remembered and prayed for.

St. James Cemetery Cleanup:

Next Sunday, November 3, at 1:00 p.m., there will be an opportunity to work together with fellow parishioners to clean up St. James the Apostle Cemetery. The cemetery is located at 95 Hector St., Trumansburg.
